FOR THE WEEK HORSCHTEL GAINED NEARLY 12 STROKES WITH HIS KARSTEN TR B60, #1 IN THE FIELD.

HORSCHTEL, WATSON 1-2 AT BMW

Fueled by an uncanny display of putting, Billy Horschel drove off with the BMW Championship by 2 shots over Bubba Watson, jumping to #2 in the FedExCup Playoffs. Horschel was #1 in strokes gained-putting for the week with his Karsten TR B60.

Horschel was also T2 in GIR with S55 irons and Tour Gorge wedges. He and Watson both relied on a G30 driver; Horschel averaged 315.9 for the week, Watson 322.8.

After the round, Horschel expressed his usual confidence heading into this week's Tour Championship in Atlanta. "I'm not going to go ahead and guarantee a victory right now," he said, "but I will say that I'm probably going to play very well and I will have a chance to win on Sunday."

3 PING PROS IN FEDEXCUP TOP 5

Three PING pros are among a select group of five players who are guaranteed to hoist the FedExCup title on Sunday with a win at the season-ending Tour Championship.

Billy Horschel (2nd), Bubba Watson (3rd) and Hunter Mahan (5th) will pocket the \$10 million bonus if they're victorious in Atlanta. In some scenarios a high finish can earn

each player the crown.

Mahan is the only PGA Tour player to reach the Tour Championship every year since the FedExCup Playoffs began in 2007, and he won the first leg of this year's playoffs. Horschel has finished T2 and 1st in the past two FedExCup tournaments. Watson is a two-time winner this season including at The Masters.

OYAMA WINS IN JAPAN

PING Pro Shiho Oyama earned her 14th career title, a two-shot victory at the GOLF 5 Ladies Pro Golf Tournament on the Japan LPGA Tour at -16 on rounds of 65-63-72. She was T2 and T4 in her previous tournaments among her eight top 10s this season. Her 63 was a career low.

She relied on a G20 driver and 3-wood, two G30 hybrids, i20 irons, Tour Gorge wedges, and a Scottsdale TR Grayhawk putter.

SHOT OF THE WEEK

Bubba Watson and his G30 driver were firing on all cylinders at the BMW Championship, where he led the field in average driving distance for all drives at 327.1 yards. And he's in the driver's seat for winning the title once again as longest driver on tour. Heading into the Tour Championship, he has a 3-yard lead over second place. His 424-yard drive with his G30 driver at the WGC-Bridgestone Invitational is the longest on tour this season, and the only one over 400 yards by any player.

'BILLY LONG' WITH G30

Among the PING pros who've documented increased ball speed and distance since switching to the G30 driver with Turbulator Technology, Billy Horschel's example is one of the most dramatic.

Horschel added a G30 driver at the PGA Championship and over his past five tournaments has averaged 300.3 yards, compared to his pre-PGA average of 288, a gain of more than 12 yards.
